PRESENTER'S BIOGRAPHY

Evette Horton, Ph.D., NCC, LPCS, RPT-S, is a Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill's School of Medicine. She has over 20 years' experience working with children and families in both school and community settings. Evette specializes in the social and emotional assessment and treatment of young children, the impact of maternal substance use on infants and children, attachment based parenting interventions, and evidence-based models of treatment for young children. Evette received her Ph.D. in Counselor Education in 2013 from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. She also has a Masters of Education from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and a Bachelor's of Science in Psychology from Bowling Green State University in Bowling Green, Ohio. She's currently President-Elect for the Association for Child and Adolescent Counseling (ACAC). She serves on the editorial board for the *Journal of Child and Adolescent Counseling*. She is also a founding board member of the North Carolina Infant Mental Health Association (NCIMHA).

Shana Malone MS, Clinical Initiatives Project Manager in the Office of the Director at the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System. Shana oversees the agency opioid initiative, and she is the Project Director on the Opioid State Targeted Response and the State Opioid Response grants. Shana has an M.S. in Human Development and completed her doctoral coursework in the School of Social and Family Dynamics at Arizona State University. Her academic work focused on computational social science, social and emotional development and dynamical systems applications. Prior to coming to AHCCCS, Shana was the Director of the Statistical Analysis Center at the Arizona Criminal Justice Commission where she helped developed the original pilot model for the Arizona Prescription Drug Misuse and Abuse Initiative. Shana has also worked on several local and national multi-systemic prevention and evaluation projects to improve health outcomes for children, youth and families, and she has experience as a family therapist in Arizona
