The Influence of Sensory Processing on the Development of Relationships and Behavior in Infants and Young Children

This training session will help the participant to understand how the influence of sensory experiences can impact play-interaction behavior styles, interpersonal behavior, and emotional self-regulation in young children. Discussion will also include how sensory preferences can interrelate with the Goodness-of-Fit model. Identification of sensory-behavioral challenges secondary to the experiences of trauma will also be presented. This workshop will address competencies required for *ITMHCA Endorsement for Culturally Sensitive*, *Relationship Focused Practice Promoting Infant Mental Health*.

Dr. Diamant is professor emeritus at AT Still University, and OT practitioner for over 30 years with a work focus on children with disabilities and their families. She is Board Certified in Pediatrics by the American Occupational Therapy Association and co-author of *Positioning for Play: Interactive Activities to Enhance Movement and Sensory Exploration*.
